### LEARNING TO GROW DENDROBIUM

PETER LIN DID AN INTERESTING TALK ON THE HUGE GENUS, DENDROBIUM. HE STRESSED THAT YOU MUST LOOK UP THE WATERING REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES. BECAUSE DENDROBIUM GROW AT SO MANY DIFFERENT ELEVATIONS AND IN SUCH DIFFERENT CONDITIONS, SOME NEED TO BE DRY ALL WINTER (NOBILE TYPES, FOR EXAMPLE) AND SOME NEED TO BE CONTINUOUSLY WATERED (like the D. phalaenopsis ones from the raffle). LOOK THEM UP ON THE WEB TO BE SURE!!
