
GREAT MEETING IN MARCH!!

BELOW IS A CHECKLIST TO BRING TO THE GREENHOUSE TOUR TO TAKE NOTES

CHECKLIST FOR OUR GREENHOUSE TOUR

As you go to each grower's growing area, make sure you find out about all their tips for growing orchids. All growers have to solve the problem of how to provide light for their plants, how to water them, how to fertilize them and provide air movement, how to control temperature, how to provide humidity, how to provide shelving, and how to provide the correct medium for them. Fancy or modest, a growing area works because it provides these basic orchid needs. The following are questions that you might keep in mind to ask when visiting our members' growing areas:

- 1. Why did you choose this kind of growing area? (greenhouse, sunroom, atrium, lights, windowsill, bathroom...)
- 2. How did you build it? What kind of material did you use? Why? Would you do it again? Did you do it yourself? Did you hire somebody? Who?
- 3. How do you provide and control light? Do you use shade cloth? Where do you put different plants to provide for high and low light? What lessons have you learned?
- 4. How do you control temperature? Do you have an evaporative cooler
- 5. What kind of shelving or tables do you use?
- 6. How do you provide humidity for your plants? What percentage are you able to provide?
- 7. How do you provide air movement? How important is this?
- 8. What kind of water do you use? (tap, deionized, r/o, bottled...) How often do you water? How? (hose, sink, misting, automatic...)
- 9. What kind of medium do you grow in? How often do you change it? Do you vary your potting medium for different plants?
- 10. What kind of fertilizer do you use? How often? Do you add any other kind of supplement (oyster shells, calcium, etc.)
- 11. How do you control pests?
- 12. What kind of orchids are you most successful with? Why is that? Are there any you have trouble growing. Why?
- 13. Where do you like to buy your orchids?
